Smell and Taste Return: Relief from Anosmia Gustatoria



Imagine the holiday season without a sense of smell or taste. It would be quite a letdown, yet that's the way

Norm Menelson had experienced Christmas and every other holiday for over 30 years.

The loss of smell (and taste) is called Anosmia Gustatoria. It can have a number of causes from a simple sinus cold to growths on the olfactory nerves. Anything that damages the olfactory nerves can cause long-term Anosmia Gustatoria. For Norm, the return of taste and smell was "accidental."
