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CAMS: Reversing Chemotherapy Heart Damage



In 2002, Nicole was diagnosed with cancer. As a retired nurse, she elected to receive both chemotherapy and radiation treatment ... and they saved her life. Today, she is cancer-free but

the consequences have taken their toll. Chemotherapy caused enlargement of the left heart ventricle and an increased heart rate.
